

MINDFUL MONDAY NOVEMBER 18TH

27 "But I say to you who are listening: Love your enemies; do good to those who hate you; 28 bless those who curse you; pray for those who mistreat you. 29 If anyone strikes you on the cheek, offer the other also, and from anyone who takes away your coat do not withhold even your shirt. 30 Give to everyone who asks of you, and if anyone takes away what is yours, do not ask for it back again. 31 Do to others as you would have them do to you.

32 "If you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners love those who love them. 33 If you do good to those who do good to you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners do the same. 34 If you lend to those from whom you expect to receive payment, what credit is that to you? Even sinners lend to sinners, to receive as much again.

Luke 6:27-34

"Calling ourselves Christian is easy, being a Christian is hard."

The message from Pastor Lynda Carlson is a reminder of a commandment that isn't easy to obey. Being kind to our enemies is hard, yet Jesus asks us to do it. Luke 6:35-38
